Subject:	Notice of FCC Forbearance Order Changes of Law, Including Discontinuance of Wholesale (Avoided Cost) Discount for Resold Services
Date Effective:	November 5, 2022 *Corrected Effective Date

Pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) Forbearance Orders,¹ Frontier is not required to provide any telecommunication service for resale at a wholesale (e.g., avoided cost) discount after the transition dates set forth in those orders. On January 14, 2020, Frontier distributed Carrier Bulletin [CCBFTR01744](#) regarding this change of law.

For any and all state(s) in which your company obtains resale services from a Frontier incumbent local exchange carrier, all resale services (embedded base and new orders) will be billed at Frontier's retail tariff rates, without a discount, effective November 5, 2022 ("Effective Date").

Per the FCC Forbearance Orders, Customer is on notice of the changes of law resulting from the FCC Forbearance Orders and Frontier's intent to implement and apply those changes, as to resale and UNEs, as of the earliest applicable date. As indicated, the changes of law per the FCC Forbearance Orders are self-effectuating and do not require an amendment. If, however, Customer desires an amendment to document any of these changes (including with respect to UNE loops), please contact your Account Manager.
